

YOU CAN HELP THE OFFICE BE MORE EFFICIENT BY CONTINUING TO:

- call the school in advance and leaving a message on the answering machine that is on 24 hours a day if you know your child will not be attending school on that day. It has been very much appreciated this year, some days we have only had to make 2 or 3 calls to parents.
- have after school plans set up with your child before the start of the day so they do not have to use the office phone at the end of the day. Thank you parents for continuing to do this.
- A convenient pick up point is near the flag poles. If someone who does not regularly pick up your child is coming please ask them to wait there and also remind your child(ren) to meet at the flag pole after school.
- get your name on our email list (information on our website). If you know of families who are not receiving our emails please encourage them to contact our office and provide us with their email address.

PLANNERS (GRADES 1-7)

Please note this is NOT a fundraiser. All students in Grades 1 through 7 have received a planner. The planner for all grades (Grades 1-7) costs \$7 Cheques are made payable to SD 68.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES (Grade 1 to Grade 3)

A reminder, if not already done, to please ensure your school supply fee (Grade 1 to Grade 3) of \$30 is paid to your child's teacher. This is not a fundraiser and we need to break even on our cost or we may not be able to offer this service to families in the future. Cheques are payable to SD 68.

- For ordering purposes, proofs for all students photographed on October 2nd will be provided to each child/family before the retake date.
- The photographer asks: parents who want a retake (time will be announced closer to the date), to return their original proofs to the photographer. Please do not return the proof envelope to the school. The photographer would like the students to physically hand their original proofs to the photographer.
- If a student was absent on the original photo day, then they would have their picture taken on the retake day.

PAC

HALLOWEEN ACTIVITIES

A few words about Halloween costumes Since we are a school, and a school that has children as young as 4 years old, we ask that parents and students keep this in mind when preparing costumes to be worn at school. Costumes should not have guns, swords (weapons of any kind) nor excessive gore. We do have a school parade and costumes have to be age appropriate even for our youngest students. Also, our school dress code still applies even on Halloween. This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer. Please note Kindergarten teachers may send home additional information regarding Halloween activities and costumes.

GRADE 6 IMMUNIZATIONS (ISLAND HEALTH)

Recently immunization consent packages for grade 6 students were sent home from the school. If you have not already done so, please return the completed consent form to the school in a sealed envelope as soon as possible. Students in grade 6 will be offered immunizations in school-based clinics with the consent of a parent(s), guardian or representative.
